Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Explain the responsibilities of your office in processing a claim: Guam has a centralized system for the administration of crime victim compensation program activity which includes processing of applications and disbursement of compensation funds. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Program within the Office of Attorney General of Guam has oversight responsibilities in regards to claim processing involves 1) providing on-going technical assistance; and, 2) routine monitoring of state standards outlining baseline claim processing requirements for local crime victim compensation programs. • How long does it take to process a VOCA claim? An applicant shall be notified within twenty (20) business days of filing whether the applicant meets eligibility and whether application is complete or incomplete. Applicant would be informed of the date and time of the hearing before the Commission. • How long does it take to cut a check for a VOCA claim? The Criminal Injuries Compensation programs disburses compensation funds on a quarterly basis, generally after a regularly scheduled claim review meeting. The Guam Department of Administration, a centralized accounting department for the government, issues check payments on victim compensation claims upon receipt of the signed payment authorizations submitted by the agency's authorized signing official. The average wait time to process claims may vary and is dependent upon if additional information is needed to process a claim and is subject to the availability of funds.
