1. **Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.**  
The number of applications for the time period 10/1/17 to 9/30/18 (FFY18) increased by 159 claims (about 4%) over the prior reporting period. The prior year showed a decrease of about 2.5%.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The claim application is entered into our Claims Processing System either on-line (by Claimant or Victim Witness personnel) or through mail-in/fax paper copy. The Intake unit will review the application and determine if the claim can be forwarded to our Investigative unit. The Investigative unit will then determine eligibility, process the claim according to statutes and forward to supervisors for final review and approval.
3. **Does your state have a victim satisfaction survey?**

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**  
There were no issues or trends encountered during the reporting period. New Jersey is fully capable and budgeted to fully meet its needs.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**  
The agency's Intake Unit works closely with the FBI and Federal victim advocates to serve federal crime victims. The Agency's staff also are members of the Human Trafficking Task Force which allow collation with Federal and State agencies.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**  
The office continued its efforts to accommodate the Spanish speaking community with further enhancements to our document processing. For example, in March, 2018, the NJ-VCCO started to send all initial intake letters and request letters (seeking more information) to Spanish speaking victims in Spanish. Our Claims Processing System identifies when a victim is Spanish speaking only.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**  
The funds are used for information technology, operations and training to improve victim compensation services.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**  
In Fiscal year 2018, a series of regulatory cap increases were adopted. The direct victim counseling services maximum increased from \$12,500 to \$20,000. The relocation services maximum increased from \$2,500 to \$3,000. Maximum payout for funeral expenses increased from \$5,000 to \$7,500. Reimbursement for transportation expenses increase from \$200 per person (max \$1,000 per claim to \$500 per person (max \$3,000 per claim). In addition, the hourly rate for attorney fees increased from \$125 per hour to \$200 per hour.
9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**  
Efforts to expand our technology based initiatives are ongoing. Claims are initiated by the county Victim Witness units through on-line filing. All required documents from the county Victim Witness units are requested and submitted through e-mail or uploaded directly into the application.
10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**  
The VCCO Public Outreach Committee is structured to inform our stakeholders and supporters about training opportunities, resources and materials to both public and private organizations, first responders, non-profits, prosecutorial staff, faith-based communities and constitutes. The VCCO sponsors annual events and campaigns; such as, Crime Victim's Right's Week held every April, Domestic Violence Month, held every October, Bullying, Sexual Awareness and other related violence related monthly topics in our continuous efforts to promote awareness and meet the needs of communities. In partnership with The Office of The Attorney General, the Agency's sponsor events are publicized and published via media outlets and our website.

No additional information is mandated by any entity. However, the Agency creates an Annual Report and posts it on-line for public access.

12. **Please provide any additional comments that are helpful to improving the Victim Compensation state and/or federal program.**

The office continues to believe that the one of the best ways to improve services to crime victims is by improving our technology. The office is continuing its outreach and processing to the Spanish speaking community. The introduction of our on-line Spanish language version of our claims processing system in FFY17 resulted in the submission of 375 (about 10% of total) applications submitted in FFY18.
