Purpose



- Enhance the quality and efficiency of services available to assist victims of human trafficking; and
- Assist providers to develop and implement effective interventions that meet the needs of human trafficking survivors.

Eligibility



- States, units of local government, federally recognized Indian tribal governments, and nonprofits, nongovernmental organizations (including tribal).
- Experience in providing technical assistance in purpose area.

Project (Purpose) Areas



- P1: Comprehensive Legal Services
- P2: Trauma-Informed Responses and Services
- P3: Increased Identification, Referrals, and Assistance of Human Trafficking in Court Settings

P1: Comprehensive Legal Services



Goal:

- Assist legal and social service providers to protect their client's legal rights, particularly victims' rights, and the civil legal remedies and legal resources available to them.
- Support identification of clients' legal needs and referrals to the most appropriate resources.

Scope:

- a) Address the comprehensive legal needs of trafficking victims, such as:
 - Civil actions
 - Employment law
 - Victims' rights
 - Criminal restitution
 - Family law
- b) Assist legal and social service providers in developing additional resources, e.g.: pro bono partnerships.

P2: Trauma-Informed Responses & Services



Goal:

- Deliver TTA to enhance providers' understanding of a trauma-informed approach;
- Assist providers to create/integrate knowledge about trauma into policies, procedures, practices; and
- Guide providers to become trauma-informed using SAMHSA's 10 Implementation Domains from [Concept of Trauma and Guidance for a Trauma-Informed Approach](#) (governance and leadership; policy; physical environment; screening assessment; treatment services; and training and evaluation).

P2: Trauma-Informed Responses & Services (Cont'd)



Scope:

- Activities may include:
- Develop and deliver training for trafficking victim service providers;
- Facilitate strategic planning sessions with Board of Directors and staff;
- Assist organizations to assess/revise current policies and practices; and
- Subaward with victim service providers to develop a trauma-informed approach.

P3: Increased Identification, Referrals & Assistance of Human Trafficking in Court Settings



Goals:

- Increase accurate identification of human trafficking victims in court settings;
- Enhance victim referrals to appropriate service providers; and
- Decrease the re-victimization of trafficking victims who interact with the justice system.

P3: Increased Identification, Referrals & Assistance of Human Trafficking in Court Settings (Cont'd)



Scope of Work:

- Assist court personnel to develop trauma-informed, victim-centered policies, procedures
- Train court personnel on human trafficking related topics, for example:
 - ✓ Intersection of human trafficking with prostitution, domestic violence, and sexual assault
 - ✓ Identification of sex and labor trafficking
 - ✓ Psychological and physiological effects of human trafficking
 - ✓ Victim safety
 - ✓ Services available to trafficking victims in relevant diversion courts
 - ✓ Subawards with courts to increase identification and enhance response to trafficking victims

Deliverables



- Develop/distribute new/existing TTA materials
- Provide training at relevant conferences, webinars or other mechanisms
- Assist service providers to develop additional resources
- Coordinate w/other OVC-funded TTA recipients

- Program Narrative
- Budget Detail Worksheet and Budget Narrative
- MOUs, Letters of Intent, and Subawards
- Plan for Action Research
- Plan for Collecting the Data
- Project Timeline
- Training Plan

- One award for e/PA, of up to \$900K
- 3-year project period
